

Installing and cleaning bronze and zinc tiles

Cutting

You can cut our tiles with any metal-cutting saw. The simplest solution is to use a hacksaw. Lubricate the saw blade with 3-in-1 Oil or WD-40.

Adhesive

Install Bronzework Studio tiles with thinset adhesive. Epoxy adhesive may also be used. To insure a good bond we recommend roughing up the back of the tiles with coarse sandpaper.

Grout

Use sanded grout. Grout release is not necessary. During your final clean-up use a small brush to make sure all grout is removed from the recesses of the tiles.

Sealing

Sealing is not necessary, although after installation you may wish to apply a light coat of paste wax to slow down the patina process.

For best results in floors

Set the tiles so they are a hair's width higher than the surrounding field material. This way, they will be continuously buffed by footsteps.

No acid (including vinegar)

As with any polished metal surface, Bronzework Studio tiles should be protected from acid-based cleaning agents, including vinegar and many grout haze removers. Acidic cleaners may discolor the tile.
